The health benefits both physical and mental of being on the water are well documented and the objective of Accessible Boating Thames is to make the river accessible to those who otherwise would struggle to access main stream services. Based at Bisham Abbey just outside Marlow it has a number of different boats to meet a variety of needs.



Wheely Boat

- Operates alongside the bell boats
- Participants can walk or roll on to the boat.
- Suitable for those pupils with mobility issues or who simply do not wish to take part in bell boating
- Ensures that all pupils are enjoying the time on the river together



Sailing Boat

- Sailed by experienced helm
- Allows participant to have the full sailing experience never having sailed before.
- Hoist available to assist those pupils with limited mobility.
