1 SGO Area Events
Open to all schools in the area/borough with the winning school from each borough being invited to the School Games County Final

2 Greater Manchester School Games County Final
This stage is organised in partnership with Manchester FA and comprises of 10 schools representing each of the boroughs in Greater Manchester

NB. An athlete can only represent their school in one event at the Greater Manchester School Games County Finals

Teams

Players must be from year 7 and/or year 8.
Maximum squad of 18 players.
9 players on the field.
Repeat substitutions are allowed.

Equipment

Junior pitch 80 x 50 yards.
Junior goals 16' x 7'.
Size 4 balls

Competition Format

The competition will be played in accordance with the official 11 v 11 Laws of the Game except for:
Size of pitch: use junior size pitch 80x50 yards.
Size of goals 16'x7'.
Substitutes: Maximum squad of 18 with repeat substitutions allowed.
Playing time: Maximum 35 mins each way.
The Football Association's standard code of rules for youth leagues will be incorporated.
During play, the decision of the referee will be final in all cases.

Competition Format

At SGO Area/Borough level, local organisers will decide on the format i.e. 'home & away' leagues, central venue festivals. Leagues are the preferred model to encourage regular participation.

Health & Safety

Long hair must be tied back.
No jewellery should be worn.
All loose clothing must be tucked in and shoelaces tied.
No chewing gum/sweets.
Players must wear shin guards and goalkeepers must wear a distinguishing playing strip.
Shin guards must be covered entirely by socks.
Please ensure your pupils bring drinks with them.
Please make sure all players warm up appropriately before each match.
All team teachers must ensure their pupils are under adult supervision at all times, even when not playing.
During this time teams can watch and encourage their fellow teams.
First aiders will be on site, however please ensure your pupils bring with them any medical supplies they may need i.e. asthma inhalers.
