■ SEND Tennis at Halton Tennis Centre

This is always a popular event with schools, and I love how we get schools from across the County from a wide array of schools attending, including primary, secondary and special needs schools.

If you read our Sporting Chance Newsletter (issued three times per year), you'll notice that SEND Tennis at Halton is often a regular feature. We run the Tennis at least three times per year, and it is led by a super group of coaches that tailor the sessions to meet both schools and individual needs. For some that may be competitive matches, and for others it may be looking at fundamental skills around hand and eye-co-ordination and could be throwing a beanbag at a target.

Our April Tennis festival saw 7 schools taking part and over 70 pupils involved in the morning.

It was lovely to see so many young people enjoying the tennis.

If you would like to try some tennis beyond the school day, Halton run a number of sessions during term-time and have a holiday programme.
